

# SUMMARY

## OFFICIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

### OF THE 2008 FAIRPORT RUBBER DUCK RACE

The race is presented by the Bird Coalition of Rochester (BirdCOR), a nonprofit program of the Genesee Valley Audubon Society (GVAS), Inc., the purpose of which is to promote conservation of and education about migratory birds and habitat. The race is being held to raise funds for BirdCOR's education and service-learning programs in the greater Rochester Area.

Rubber ducks will be dropped into the Erie Canal in Fairport, NY at approximately 3 p.m., on June 8, 2008.

One thousand rubber ducks will be entered into the race. All ducks entered will be provided by BirdCOR and shall remain the property of BirdCOR.

A number will be attached to each duck relating to the number on the duck adoption application. Multiple duck entries from one duck adoption application will be assigned additional numbers for identification.

Each duck adoption application must be completed in full and delivered to a member of Genesee Valley Audubon Society conducting the duck race or an authorized representative of GVAS or mailed to BirdCOR, PO Box 10562, Rochester, NY 14610.

No purchase is necessary in order to enter or win. BirdCOR does request a donation of \$5.00 per entry to benefit conservation and education programs. Free race entry defeats the charitable fundraising purpose of the event and is not encouraged. However, one free race entry per household can be obtained by presenting a handwritten request to the address listed in Paragraph 6 above and submitting therewith a self-addressed, stamped envelope for mailing of the duck adoption application. Requests for free race entries are limited to one per household. Requests for free race entry made after 5 p.m., June 3, 2008, or after 500 ducks have been adopted will not be honored. BirdCOR, in its sole discretion, can increase the number of ducks and change the deadline.

The winner of the grand prize will be the holder of the ticket corresponding to the first duck across the finish line (i.e., the number attached to that duck plus 1,000 times the numeral 0 through the thousandths place of the number of tickets sold as drawn from a container of certificates bearing said numerals). The winners of the remaining prizes will be the holders of the tickets whose stubs are drawn from the container of all sold ticket stubs, excluding the grand prize winning ticket.

Winners will be announced at the Duck Race Awards Ceremony between approximately 4 p.m. and 5 p.m., on June 8, 2008. Entrants will, where necessary, also be notified by the United States mail, telephone, or e-mail. Ticket holders need not be present to win.

Any and all winners agree to allow BirdCOR to use their names and likenesses for promotional purposes without further compensation.
